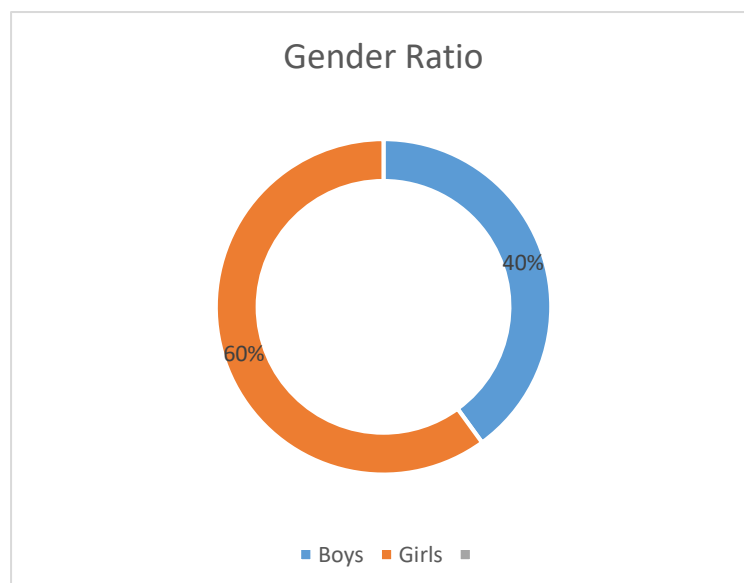
2. Scholastic

GENDER RATIO IN CLASS:-

ANK is deeply committed to fostering women empowerment right from the earliest stages of education. As part of this commitment, we strive to maintain a minimum of 60% female student admissions across all our projects. This aligns with the Government of India's Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao program, which emphasizes the importance of educating and empowering girls. Through this proactive approach, we aim to create a more inclusive and equitable educational environment for young girls, setting the stage for their brighter futures.



ENGLISH SESSION:-

Learning English is really important for kids because it helps them talk to people from all over the world and gives them more chances in life.

At ANK, we know how important English is, so we have fun activities to help kids get better at it. MATHS SESSION:-

G.K SESSION:-

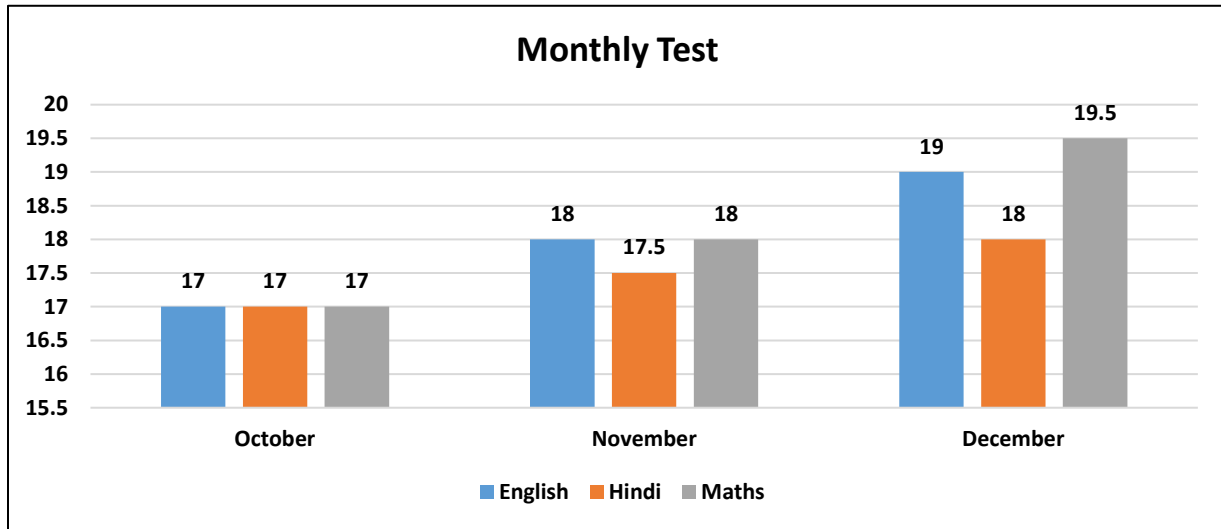

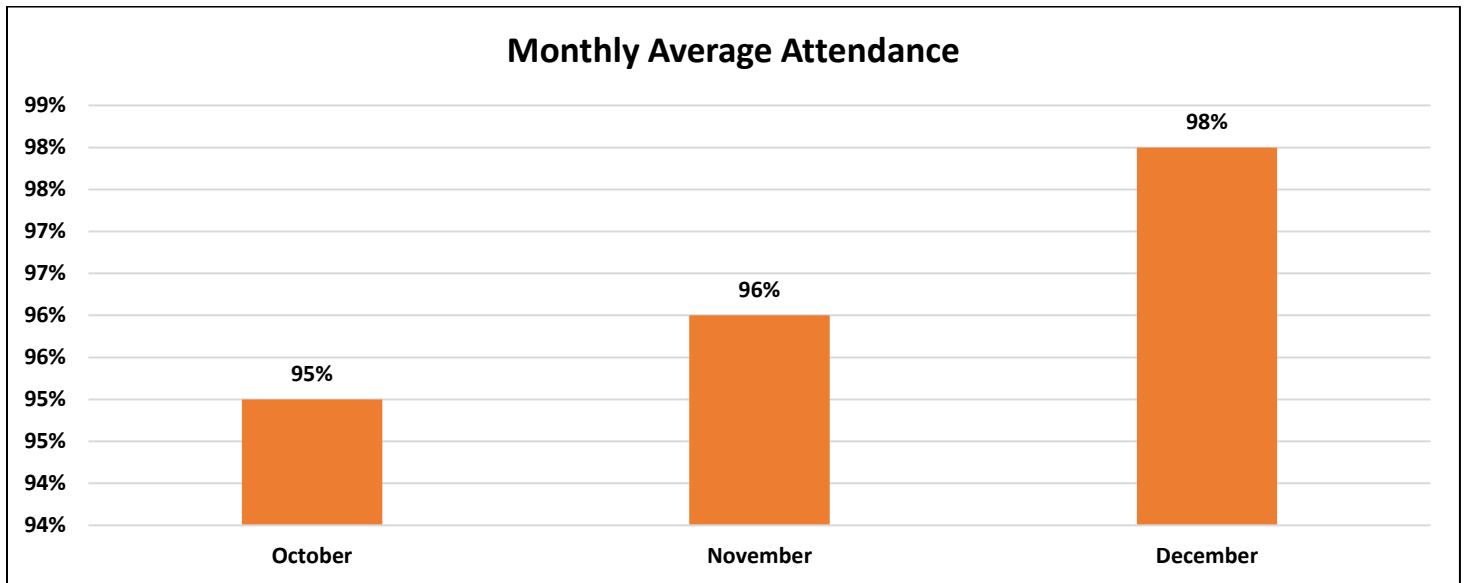

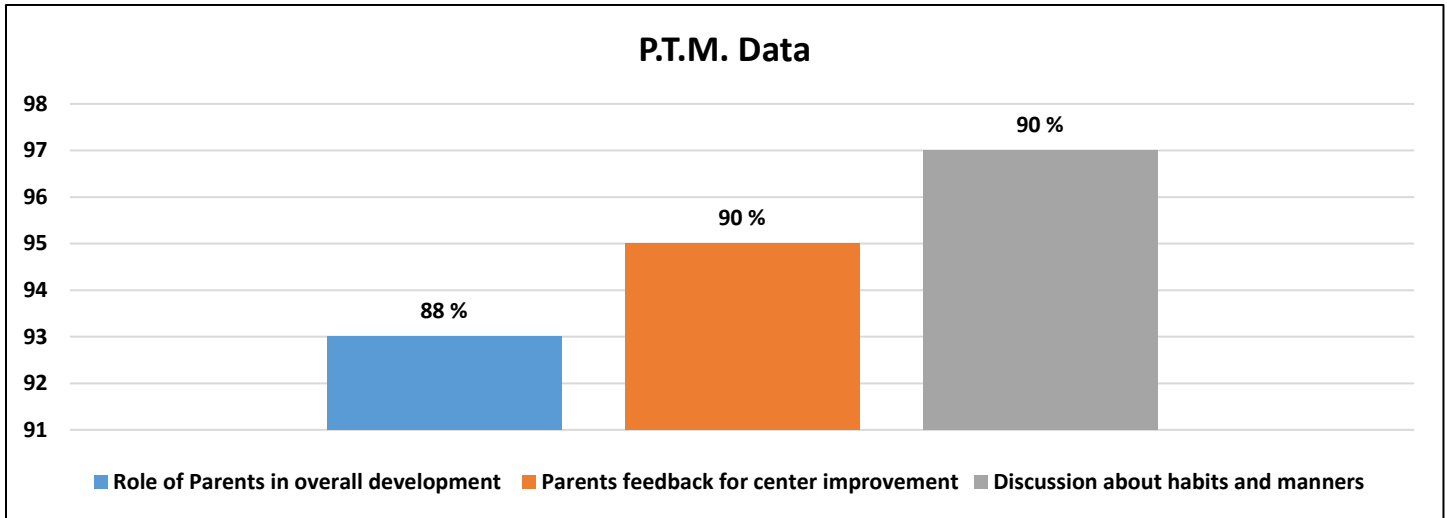

7. CASE STUDIES

She seeks help from teachers whenever possible and tries to make the most of her education.

Teachers of our center recognize her potential and offer extra help during lunch breaks or after the class. They provide additional learning materials like library books and encourage her to participate in all the activities.
